When Sleep Goes Wrong Event

Dr Aiste Stepnonenaite recently co-organised the "When Sleep Goes Wrong" event with colleagues from KMMS, UoK, CCCU and Queen Victoria Hospital on 8th November.

This initiative aims to enhance insomnia care in primary settings by equipping healthcare/practice professionals with foundational knowledge and skills in managing chronic insomnia.

The course introduces participants to the science of sleep, the diagnosis and treatment of insomnia, and emerging technologies in sleep tracking. It also explores complex sleep disorders through engaging case studies and expert-led discussions.

MSoP PhD student Uche Ani also presented his research on "Enhancing Awareness of Sleep Disordered breathing Among Primary Healthcare workers (PHCWs) in Nigeria and UK".

The next "When Sleep Goes Wrong Event" event is scheduled for 14th March to celebrate World Sleep Day by educating primary healthcare professionals on sleep. Booking will be open soon.


You may have spotted our new MSoP mascot chilling out in Anson reception over the last few weeks (Sporting a rather festive hat at the moment).
